# 2023 Community Report











2023 was a year of growth and impact. One of the most visible changes was our rebranding to Colorado Gives Foundation—a name that reflects the trust and connection Coloradans have with Colorado Gives Day. While our name changed, our mission did not. We are still a community foundation working to connect people, ideas and nonprofits whether through our

focused work in Jefferson County (Jeffco) or our statewide efforts. Everything we do is driven by a goal to make good happen.

### **Building Resilient Communities in Jeffco**

In Jeffco, we're dedicated to building a resilient and connected community where everyone can thrive. We support local nonprofits through grantmaking and foster connections between people, businesses and nonprofits. In 2023, we proudly awarded over \$10 million in grants to nonprofits that are working to ensure everyone in Jeffco can thrive.

One of our most significant initiatives is the Bring it Home Fund, created to address the rising cost of housing—an issue that's impacting our neighbors, communities and even our economy. With \$15 million in seed funding and additional support from donors, the fund is already making a difference. Through investments in the Colorado Housing Accelerator Initiative (CHAI) and Foothills Regional Housing, we're increasing the supply of housing that's affordable for middle-income households.

This work is about more than numbers. It's about people-like the recent college graduate who grew up in Jeffco but was priced out of the housing market and couldn't 'return' home.

Thanks to these investments, we're creating opportunities for individuals, like our recent college graduate, and families to come home to live and raise their kids in Jeffco and build their futures.

#### **Our Statewide Impact**

Beyond Jeffco, our focus statewide is to build the capacity of donors and nonprofits to maximize their impact. ColoradoGives.org, our online giving platform, is at the heart of this effort, making it easy and joyful for donors to support any of the thousands of verified nonprofits across the state.

2023 was a remarkable year for giving to nonprofits. Coloradans came together and donated \$69.2 million through ColoradoGives. org, with \$54.2 million donated on Colorado Gives Day alone. Additionally, our donor advised funds (DAFs) proved to be a powerful tool for giving, facilitating \$7.7 million in grants to nonprofits. Acting as a charitable savings account, DAFs allow donors to put money in, receive the full taxable deduction allowable by law, and then use the fund to support the nonprofit causes they care about.

We also introduced new business-giving products to help businesses connect with local causes. These achievements are a testament to the commitment and generosity of our donors, partners and businesses. We're excited for what lies ahead.

### Our Vision for a Thriving Jeffco

We believe a thriving community is one where everyone feels they truly belong, and where giving and receiving are equally important – we call this connectedness. It's a place where people can shape their own community through active participation and civic involvement. To help make this vision a reality, our community impact work focused on four key areas and granted more than \$10 million to nonprofits serving Jefferson County.

### Essential Needs

We supported immediate needs and long-term solutions to drive better access to food, housing, safety and health care (physical, dental and mental) for Jeffco residents.

# **Economic Prosperity**

When all our neighbors are economically secure, everyone benefits.

We worked to create good-paying jobs and help our neighbors find and keep them. This included ensuring everyone has access to quality education, from early childhood through high school, along with job training and skill-building opportunities.

# Resilient & Connected Neighborhoods

When people are connected to each other in community, they generate the ability to solve their problems together to make neighborhoods and communities thrive – we call this resiliency or social capital.

We supported community-driven and initiated projects to protect community assets and to make neighborhoods safe, welcoming and inclusive across generations.




## Civic Engagement

When more people know how our government works and how people live together in a community, we get closer to creating communities that work for everyone.

We supported civic education through: active participation in local community organizations, clubs and events; volunteerism; access to reliable information; youth engagement; public forums; voting accessibility; civic mentorship; leadership and arts/cultural engagement.

### Impact through Grantmaking

To support a thriving community, below is a breakdown of our grants.



- Civic Engagement
- \$6,000 to continue additional program support with food for the Family Leadership Training Institute
- \$58,523 to support civic connectivity and engagement in Wheat Ridge, community learning academies, and voter engagement.
- \$50,000 for Edgewater Collective to support efforts in reducing poverty and increasing community engagement in Lakewood, Wheat Ridge and Edgewater.
- \$314,000 to support Jeffco Public Schools in ensuring the successful transitions of students and families affected by school closures.
- \$100,000 to support Spring/Summer Camp Programming from Boys & Girls Club.
- \$6,000 to support Jeffco Outdoors Foundation Family Leadership Institute Training.







### Good for Business

Giving back feels good—and it's good for business. Through sponsorships, business donor advised funds and employee giving, we connected businesses to the causes and nonprofits they care about to help them make an impact in Colorado.

### BUSINESS SPONSORSHIPS AND EMPLOYEE GIVING

At Colorado Gives Foundation, we provide a variety of options for businesses to make an impact through sponsorships. Each offers an opportunity for philanthropic support while benefiting from brand exposure and creating a culture of generosity.

As one of Colorado's top corporate philanthropists, FirstBank continued their sponsorship of Colorado Gives Day. FirstBank's generous donation of more than \$600,000 in prizes and in-kind marketing support helped inspire more Coloradans to donate for Colorado Gives Day.

- In partnership with Delta Dental of Colorado, we launched the Corporate Challenge, empowering companies and their employees to make a difference. Through the power of gamification, this innovative initiative united 126 businesses to rally support and raise over \$500,000 in funds for the nonprofits they care about most.
- Partnering with Janus Henderson Investors, we launched a #GivingTuesday campaign to bring this global day of generosity home to Colorado.
- Southwest Airlines didn't just sponsor the Colorado Gives Day kickoff—they fueled generosity in a big way! By offering giving cards on local Colorado flights, they turned everyday travel into an opportunity to give back and they also inspiring countless donors to support the causes that make our community stronger by giving away Southwest airline tickets.



### Corporate Challenge Highlights



The first 100 companies that raised \$1,000 for Colorado Gives Day received a \$1,000 match from Delta Dental of Colorado.

- 570 new donors gave through the corporate challenge
- 1,140 donors made 2,550 donations through the corporate challenge
- \$461.82 was the average amount donated per donor through business giving pages
- 126 business pages received donations
- \$526,478 raised
- 834 nonprofits received donations

### Building Nonprofit Capacity

Colorado Gives Foundation is dedicated to helping nonprofits succeed and thrive. We provide tools, resources and education to support nonprofits so they can stay focused on delivering the programs and services that help communities thrive.

We also provide a variety of marketing templates, webinars, programs and materials to help nonprofits be more successful with digital fundraising.

### DIGITAL FUNDRAISING WITH COLORADOGIVES.ORG

Since 2007, nonprofits in Colorado have been fundraising on ColoradoGives.org. Nonprofits use our fundraising platform year-round because we've made it easy for donors to give, and every December we also host Colorado Gives Day, one of the biggest giving events in the nation.

In 2023, thanks to a partnership with The Schlessman Family Foundation, we launched a three-year program called Level Up Digital Fundraising to help nonprofits take their online fundraising to new levels.

### **SECURING FUTURES**

Endowments help nonprofits protect their futures and give them funding when they need it most. In 2023, we helped endowment partners access two million dollars from their endowments to support critical work while still preserving and investing their funds for years to come. Colorado Gives Foundation stewards 141 endowment and/or long-term funds.

#### **CATCHAFIRE CAPACITY BUILDING**

Colorado Gives Foundation provided our endowment partners and Jeffco nonprofits a free membership to Catchafire. This service connects nonprofits with skilled volunteers to help organizations complete a variety of projects, ranging from marketing brochures and new websites, to donor engagement campaigns.

- 5,759 hours of volunteer support donated
- 205 organizations completed projects

A DAF helps donors enjoy immediate tax benefits when they contribute to the fund, then support the nonprofits they care about. A DAF at Colorado Gives Foundation is a great option for those seeking convenience, personalized support and a desire to make a difference in their communities.

### Investing for Impact

Impact investing allows us to leverage our endowment for greater community impact. It complements our grantmaking because impact investments are made to achieve community impact while earning a financial return.

This year, we made our largest charitable investment to date when we seeded the Bring it Home Fund with a \$15 million commitment to help address the affordable housing challenges in Jefferson County.

#### **BRING IT HOME**

In 2023, we made two investments from the Bring it Home Fund. Those investments included:

- Colorado Housing Accelerator Initiative - \$1.5 million to support innovative housing collaborations
- Foothills Regional Housing \$500,000 to complete Vance Street Lofts in Wheat Ridge, Colorado
